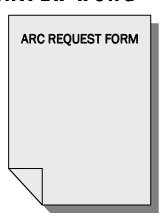

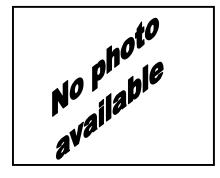

ROOF STAINS: THE ORIGIN OF THE SPECIES—ELLIS SHARADIN

Last fall, the Association warned Tabb Lakes homeowners that you had until this summer to take care of two major home issues: rusted chimney caps and stained roofs. Why did your Association make these an issue? Well. we explained the problem several times in past newsletters, but to reiterate: When we asked local realtors what could be done to maintain property values in Tabb Lakes, they quickly identified these two issues and their effects on home prices. In short, rusted chimney caps and stained roofs cause our neighborhood homes to look OLD and DECREPIT, as compared to the freshness seen in newer neighborhoods such as the Greenlands. Considering the first part of Tabb Lakes was built in the mid-80's, many of our roofs have already reached the limit of their lifespan in both appearance and performance. BUT - if you expect your home to bring in a good price someday, you should make an effort to either replace or revitalize these roof components if you expect to compete with newer homes. And

since the Association is charged, by the Covenants, with maintaining property values and attractiveness of our community, it falls on your Board of Directors to pursue any and all avenues that may affect those qualities; otherwise, we wouldn't be doing our job.

So why do our roofs become stained over time? Following is an explanation, courtesy of the Internet.

Asphalt shingle roofs have been in use since the 1800s. Early versions were made from felts containing cotton or wool fibers. In the early 1940s, cellulose fibers derived from recycled paper or wood began being used to manufacture asphalt shingle mat. Since the late 1970s, the primary material has been inorganic fiberglass mat (over 80% of the current market). The mat is coated with asphalt that is then covered with a protective layer of U.V. resistant, colored ceramic granules. In

manufacturing fiber-glass asphalt shingles, <u>limestone</u> is used as a void filler between individual mats and also provides resistance to fire and weather. Unfortunately, limestone is a favorite food for the blue-green algae, Gloeocapsa magma, that causes dark stains on these fiberglass asphalt

shingle roofs.

According to the Asphalt Roofing Manufacturing Association, asphalt shingle roofs repre-

sent 80 to 85% of the current residential roofing market. When the popularity of these shingles is considered, plus the current use of limestone filler, it's easy to understand the reason for the wide spread occurrence of algae caused roof stains, especially in areas with high humidity. These are areas most likely to be impacted by stain causing roof algae, Gloeocapsa magma, as well as other stains caused by mildew and mold. Moss and lichen

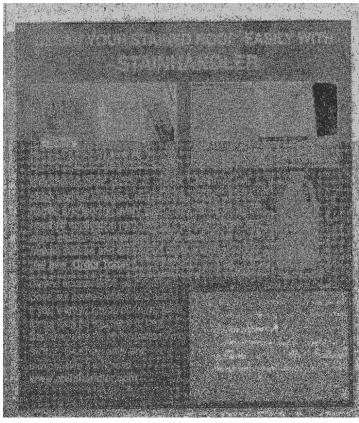
grow on roofs in these areas as well; however, moss and lichen tend to occur on roofs more in the Northeast and Northwest climate areas.

Growth is more prevalent on the north and west facing surfaces of the roof (and highly shaded areas) due to the reduced amount of sun received by these surfaces. After a rain, these roof surfaces tend to not dry completely and thus provide an ideal area for algae growth. As algae grows on the roof, it holds even more moisture which accelerates the growth. The results is ugly roof stains that continue to worsen over time.

So what can you do to rid yourself of roof stains, assuming your shingles are still in serviceable condition and don't need replacement? First, you can treat your roof with algaecides that will kill the algae as well as bleach the stains away. There are any number of companies who will sell you products or services to remove the stains.

Another thing you can do by way of prevention is to have a roofer install zinc-galvanized flashing strips along the top of the roofline. Over time, the zinc particles are slowly washed down the roof during rains. and they inhibit the growth of algae. It's a very effective solution, 90 90 90 90 90 90 90 90 90 90 90

but you need to clean the roof first, and then install the strips. If you are installing a brandnew roof, remember to have your installers include zinc strips on the peak as a long-term algae preventive and you'll keep your house looking new for a long time. Well, that about covers it. You can anticipate the Association will continue its emphasis on cleaning up our rooflines. The solutions (no pun intended) are readily available to you, practical, and affordable. Make it a point to survey your roof yourself and take corrective action now while the weather is still good enough to deal with it. You'll be glad you did. and your neighbors will, too.

Stop texting and Drive! It's the Law.

Effective July 1, Virginians who send or read text messages or e-mails while driving will be breaking the law and will face a fine. This new law was included in the Board of Supervisors' legislative Program for 2009 at the recommendation of the Transportation Safety Commission. There are several exceptions, including emergency vehicle operators, drivers reporting an emergency, and drivers who are parked. Also, texting while driving is a secondary offense, meaning a law enforcement officer must have a different reason to stop or arrest the driver. The fine is \$20 for a first offense and \$50 for a second offense.

Safety Office
encourage motorists to
avoid distractions,
such as texting, while
driving. Last year there
were 28,395 crashes
in the Commonwealth

involving driver distraction. Those crashes killed 114 people and injured another 14, 480

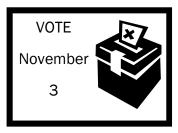

Don't be left holding the bag.

Here's what NOT to do when placing your trash out for pickup every week.

- 1. Over-filled container/lid doesn't close.
- 2. Too heavy—dirt, sod or other items that make container weigh more than 240 lbs.
- 3. Debris sticking out of container.
- Container is too close to a mailbox, car/truck, and/or driveway end walls.
- Bags, bricks, or any other items are placed on top of container lid.
- 5. Paint cans, chemicals, cooking oils, or any liquid items placed into trash containers. By state law, liquid items are strictly prohibited from being placed into your trash container. York County provides Household Chemical and Computer Drop-off Collection five times a year. Visit www.vppsa.org/hhc.htm
- Containers are not out when the trash truck is collecting your side of the street.

These are the seven most recorded reasons why trash is not collected. If you are left holding the bag, you may take your trash to the Waste Management Center at 145 Goodwin neck Road.
