DUMPING IN THE LAKES IS ILLEGAL — BOB SPELL

Information has come to the Board's attention that some construction materials may recently have been dumped into one of the Association's lakes. York County deems dumping into lakes a serious code violation. The penalty for conviction of a violation is a fine not exceeding one thousand dollars (\$1,000) or thirty (30) days imprisonment for each violation or both. Only rain water, tap water, or purified drinking water or professionally applied water quality maintenance chemicals may be put into the lakes. Otherwise NOTHING can

legally be dumped into our lakes.

Anyone contemplating dumping into the community lakes should be aware that:

- Most residents are as interested in protecting our lakes as the County and the Association.
- Nearly everyone carries a camera whenever they are outside.
- If you dump any object you may be required to retrieve it.
- If you dump anything

that alters the water quality you may be required to pay for remedial treatment of the water.

THE PENALTY FOR CONVICTION OF A VIOLATION IS A FINE NOT EXCEEDING ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000) OR THIRTY (30) DAYS IMPRISON-MENT FOR EACH VIO-LATION OR BOTH.

> Water in our lakes that doesn't evaporate flows eventually to the Chesapeake Bay or connected bodies of water.

WINTER WEATHER PREPARATIONS AND HOME Fire safety — lou lafrenaye

Below is some information from FEMA, the Red Cross, and the U.S. Fire Administration to help everyone plan for and prepare for winter emergencies and the threat of winter home fires.

The threat of winter fires is real.

- 905 people die in winter home fires each year.
- \$2,091,000,000 in property loss occurs from winter home fires.
- 67 percent of winter fires occur in one- and two-family homes.
- Cooking is the leading cause of all winter home fires.
- 5 to 8 p.m. is the most common time for winter home fires. Source: National Fire Incident Re-

The Two-Minute Rule

Are You and your Children prepared?

Imagine being sound asleep in the middle of the night when suddenly your smoke alarms start blaring. Your house is filling with smoke. Do you and your children know what to do? According to the American Red Cross (ARC), fire experts agree that people have about two minutes to escape a burning home.

The ARC created the <u>Home Fire</u> <u>Preparedness Campaign</u> to reduce the number of fire related deaths and injuries. You can help prepare your family by having a fire escape plan that includes the following:

- Make sure all members of the household know how to get out of every room in the house;
- Pick a place outside where everyone can meet and be sure everyone knows where it is;
- Practice waking up to smoke alarms, low crawling and meeting outside;
- Practice with your children!
- Practice your home fire drill until everyone in the house can do it in less than two minutes; and
- Make sure everyone knows how to call '911'.

The U.S. Fire Administration (USFA) says people are at greater risk for home fires during the winter months. Now that the season is here, use ARC's <u>printable worksheet</u> and begin planning; then check out the <u>video</u> from the USFA to learn how to conduct a fire drill with your family today. Blacked Out

A severe winter ice or snow storm can knock out power to your home. Because the length of an outage can vary from a few hours to several days, you should plan to get by without utilities for at least three days. With winter in full swing, preparation is necessary to stay safe! Here are some tips to prepare your family for a black out:

Build an emergency supply kit:

Make a <u>family communications</u> <u>plan</u>;

- Keep your car's gas tank at least half full at all times; and
- Know where the manual release lever of your garage door is located and how to operate it.

During a black out, it is important to remember to:

- Use only flashlights or emergency lighting, NEVER use candles due to the risk of fires;
- Keep one light on so that you know when power returns;
- Conserve your cell phone battery and only use it for life threatening situations;
- Put on layers of warm clothing; and
- Do not use your oven as a heating source.

Being prepared is imperative and

could make the difference between a minor inconvenience



and a major emergency.

YORK COUNTY CODES FOR SOLICITATION WITHIN SUBDIVISIONS — DAVID ALLEN

Over the past 5 months or so, we have had several incidents of solicitors going door to door within our subdivision. One such incident was reported to be of a salesman who knocked on a door at 7:30 p.m.

The State of Virginia, as well as York County, have specific laws pertaining to such solicitors under the Virginia Home Solicitation Sales Act as well as individual county or city codes <u>Please be aware that ANY Individual or Organization must</u> <u>have a Peddlers or Solicitors License unless otherwise exempted.</u>

Solicitors offer a wide variety of goods and services for sale. Solicitors may be selling goods or services such as magazine subscriptions, tree work, firewood, driveway sealing, coupon books, or meat; or "setting ap-

pointments" for highspeed internet/cable service, home improvements, or home security alarms. Other

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solicitors may be local school organizations; chorus, band, sports clubs and the like. With this stated, Section 18.2-1, under Definitions, subsection (b) Exceptions, line (9) Members of any nonprofit religious, civic or charitable organization must have means of identification provided by such organization.

For your safety, it is always wise on your part that if some-

one does solicit for a sale of goods, ALWAYS ask the solicitor for their permit/license. If the solicitor states that they do not have one or are not aware of such law, then immediately thank them and close the door. If you wish to file a complaint, then call the York-Poquoson Sheriff's Office and state you have a non-licensed peddler/ solicitor in your neighborhood.

Below are selected paragraphs from York County Code, Solicitations, Section 18.2-2, 2-22

CODE OF THE COUNTY OF YORK, VIRGINIA CHAPTER 18.2 Sec. 18.2-2. Prohibited acts.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person to act as a solicitor, without first securing a solicitor's permit from the Sheriff.

> (b) It shall be unlawful for any solicitor to ring the bell, or knock on the door, or otherwise attempt to gain admittance for the purpose of soliciting at any residence, dwelling or apart-

ment at which a sign bearing the words "No Peddlers or Solicitors" or words of similar import indicating that such persons are not wanted on said premises, is painted, affixed or otherwise exposed to public view.

(c) It shall be unlawful for any solicitor to solicit between the hours of one-half hour before sunset and 9:00 a.m. the follow-

ing morning, or at any time on Sundays, except by specific appointment with or invitation from the prospective customer.

(d) It shall be unlawful for any solicitor to fail to disclose to the prospective buyer, upon request, his name and the name of the company, product or organization he represents, and if requested so to do, to leave the premises immediately. Any solicitor who enters upon premises owned, leased or rented by another and refuses to leave such premises after having been notified by the owner or occupant of such premises, or his agent, to leave the same and not return to such premises, shall be deemed quilty of a class 2 misdemeanor.

(e) It shall be unlawful for any solicitor to make any assertion, representation or statement of fact which misrepresents the purpose of his call, or use any plan, scheme, or ruse which misrepresents such purpose in the course of carrying on the activity for which the permit is granted.

(f) It shall be unlawful for any solicitor to fail to provide, at the request of the purchaser, a written receipt, which receipt shall be signed by the person making the sale and shall set forth a brief description of the goods or services sold, the total purchase price thereof, amount of cash payment, if any, and the balance due and terms of payment.

(CONTINUED FROM PAGE 4) YORK COUNTY CODES For solicitation within subdivisions

(g) It shall be unlawful for any person issued a permit pursuant to this Chapter to use or exploit the fact of being issued a permit so as to lead the public to believe that such registration in any manner constitutes an endorsement or approval by this County. Permitting does not imply endorsement by York County.

(h) It shall be unlawful for any person to give any false or misleading information in connection with his application for a permit required by this Chapter. (i) It shall be unlawful for any solicitor to conduct himself in a disorderly or unlawful manner.

Sec. 18.2-22. Possession of permit and copy of permit to be provided The holder of a solicitor's permit issued under this chapter shall have his solicitor's permit in his possession at all times and shall exhibit such permit at any time upon request by any law enforcement officer of the County, by any purchaser, or by any person being solicited. It shall be unlawful for any person required to be issued a permit by this Chapter to refuse to exhibit to a prospective purchaser, purchaser, or to the Sheriff that permit after being requested to do so.




