N°	ACTIVITIES	☑
1	Clean gutters and downspouts: Remove accumulated debris and check for any damage.	0
2	 Wash house siding and exterior surfaces: Use a gentle cleaner and soft brush or pressure washer. 	0
3	Control weeds: Apply weed control then remove weeds from yards, flower beds, and driveway aprons.	0
4	 Clean and perform regular maintenance on mailboxes and posts; Use a mild cleaner and water to remove any dirt or growth. Repair, repaint, and straighten posts as necessary. 	0
5	Prune trees and shrubs: Remove dead or damaged branches.	0
6	Prepare flower beds: Refresh soil and mulch, and remove dead or diseased plants.	0
7	 Remove loose debris: Rake up leaves and other accumulated materials, especially in drainage ditches. 	0
8	 Inspect and repair outdoor structures: Check for damage to sheds, fences, and other structures. 	0

SQUIRREL PROOF YOUR BIRD FEEDER—KEITH EBERT

For many years, my wife and I have had different bird feeders either mounted on a pole or suspended from a tree limb. During those years, the squirrels have always figured out a way to get to the bird seed on the feeders. My wife did some research online and ordered 19 Inch Two-In-One Squirrel Baffle For Bird Feeder Pole/ Shepherd's Hook, Raccoon Buster Set With Spikes. The spikes can be attached around the pole below the feeder and are secured with plastic zip ties, which are included with the order. Gloves are provided with the purchase because the spikes are VERY SHARP on two sides. The spikes come in long sections, which I cut to fit exactly around the pole at different vertical levels. I attached the 19-inch diameter plastic baffle to the pole directly below the bird feeder. Before I added the spikes to the pole, the squirrels were climbing up the pole and started chewing on the Baffle edges. My wife ordered both items at Amazon.com for \$24.99. See picture.

Originally, I installed both items on a skinny pole which I quickly realized couldn't support the weight of the bird feeder full of bird seed. I then installed a heavier pole, attached the bird feeder, and added the spikes and the baffle to the new pole. To date, we have not seen one squirrel on

the bird feeder. Tip: make sure the pole and feeder are far away from tree branches and any other objects that a squirrel can climb up and then jump onto the feeder. If you want to keep squirrels away from your bird feeder mounted on a pole, I highly recommend using the spikes and the baffle system.
